Who is Club Soda?

Club Soda is a disability-led charity in Croydon providing creative, music and media opportunities for people with learning disabilities.

Our advisory board, the AdFizzory Group, is made up of adults with learning disabilities from different areas of our charity who help make creative decisions about how we run.

We are a charity for Creatives, Campaigners & Gig Goers!

We run weekly workshops in music making, djing and media. We mentor artists who produce original music, deliver inclusive live events and perform across London.

Our Gig Buddies Croydon project matches adults with learning disabilities to volunteers with similar interests so they can enjoy the things they love together.

Our Leisure Link Project is a group for people with learning disabilities who meet once a month to produce a monthly magazine about inclusive and accessible events in Croydon, review venues & events and produce a popular podcast.

We have a rebellious spirit and want to shake up our local community for the better. *Everyone has the right to enjoy a social life, be the last on the dance floor or be the DJ!*

Our media training project is a pioneering initiative aimed to empower young adults with special educational needs and disabilities by providing them with access to high-quality arts training and valuable work experience opportunities.

Our primary objectives are to foster creativity, enhance employability, and promote inclusivity within the community.

Since the project began in 2022, media team have members have developed their skills, showcased their talents and were able to access and enjoy music and the arts. The media team used their talents to create original content that has been live streamed on Club Soda's social media channels.

Club Soda seeks expressions of interest for a Media Team Leader role. As a leader in our pioneering media training project, you'll empower young adults with special educational needs and disabilities with skills relating to digital media production. This role offers an opportunity to make a meaningful impact on the lives of young people.

Our media training initiative empowers young individuals with diverse abilities, providing access to arts training and valuable work experience opportunities.

You will lead regular sessions in filming, interviewing, live streaming, podcasting, and more for young people with learning disabilities.

Training Goals:

- 1. Skills Development: Equipping participants with creative skills in photography, filmmaking, podcasting, live streaming, and social media management through hands-on training.
- 2. Inclusive Arts Access: Make the arts more inclusive by showcasing participants' work at live events and through digital media, challenging stereotypes, and highlighting creative abilities.
- 3. Employment Pathways: Bridge the gap between artistic skill development and employability, preparing trainees for careers in the arts and other fields, enhancing employment prospects, and promoting independence.
